Dear Friends.

What a strange time we find ourselves in. I do hope you are managing to look after yourself and stay well. Being separated in this way is making us think seriously about how Church works, what it means to be a part of the body of Christ, and how we can stay connected in worship, prayer and fellowship.

Many of you have been engaging in some of our online prayer times. We have been holding live streamed meetings on Facebook four times a day for the past two weeks.



We have joined in the ancient tradition of saying morning prayer, midday prayer, evening prayer and compline (night prayer).

I am finding this is giving deep rhythm to my day. It has always been my custom to say morning prayer and night prayer on behalf of the people in the parish and the world and the church. It has been enriching to add those two further times of prayer and a special blessing having people join me from their own homes to pray with me. In some ways it has made me feel more connected to our church family rather than less.

There are of course lots of people who are not on social media and we have been offering to send an email with a link to our prayer services immediately after they have finished. If you would like to receive this please would you email me at blackmorevicarage@gmail.com.

We are also trying to keep in touch with those who don't use any type of technology. It has been so nice to speak with people on the telephone. I have also been sending out postcards with notes of encouragement and assurance of my prayers.

Whilst this pandemic and current crisis is incredibly troubling and may cause us some worry and anxiety we must look for the moments that bring us joy, peace and love.

For me I have found moments of beauty, peace, joy and love in connecting with parishioners in this new way, having requests for help from people I've never met in

the community and building new relationships, being mindful of other people and their needs, and taking the time out to pray each day.

I have found such joy in the deepening of friendships in ways I expect would not have happened if we were not going through this current time of trial each day.

The Bible tells us that suffering is often the path to growth, love and glory. I pray that during this time of enforced social distancing, isolation and disconnection you will find that your relationships become closer, that you will be surrounded by friends and family even if they can't be in the same room and that you will feel more closely connected to those whom you love.

Above all I pray that you will take this time to cultivate a relationship that really is life changing and life giving. A relationship with the living God the Father through the person of Jesus Christ, His Son, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

A special thanks to the Pastoral care team who were unstinting in their care and concern, not just my welfare but that of June's also. It is most reassuring to have such provision in a church whereby physical needs are met as are spiritual and prayer support. A special thank you to Jenny Dodd who went the extra mile and beyond in her Pastoral role and to Alan Dodd for the support given to Jenny in her caring role.

I must confess I had great difficulty praying for myself even in the most difficult of times in the hospital. I don't understand this but it seemed almost selfish on my part to be saying to God help me out again, or was I so sure of his love and care for me that I took for granted a loving father would never abandon his child. I do know I had a peace and reassurance that all would be well and again thank those who held me in their prayers.

In the coming weeks and months us seniors will be faced with the challenge of avoiding infection from the coronavirus as so many in our village will be at risk.

Let us pray they will be given every assistance so their needs are met and are not subject to exposure to the virus.

Matthew 28.10

"I am with you always"

The eleven disciples met Jesus on a mountain in Galilee where Matthew tells us 'they worshiped him; but some doubted' (v17). Jesus knew their (and knows our) human frailty. However he had a great task for them which was to go and make disciples of all nations.

How would they do that? What would they say and do? Jesus knew this task would leave them feeling anxious so he left them with these final words "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

In these difficult times there will be days where we are able to worship, pray, read, learn and engage with the Living God. Yet we will also have days where we struggle to find His presence in our daily lives and in what we see going on in our communities, country and around the world.

REACHING THE NATIONS

Sean Wood, working with Agapé UK

We're currently living in very strange times. I've certainly not experienced anything before, that has had such an impact on society, as that which we're currently experiencing with the Covid-19 pandemic. The only thing in my experience that I can really compare it to is the odd 'snow days' that occasionally lead to school closures and public transport grinding to a halt! The media certainly seems to have had a mixed effect; it's undoubtedly helpful to be made aware of any sort of healthcare threat, but I also can't help but feel that the volume of reporting has led some to panic and overreact, such as we've seen with the unnecessary panic buying. But, I'm certainly no expert, so I'm trying to reserve judgement.

It's been a difficult few weeks in my work. Covid-19 has led to the cancellation of all of our global projects to Malta, Greece and St. Petersburg, Russia (global projects are our short-term overseas trips that we provide for UK university students to go to meet with Agapé teams in other countries and work alongside them for a few weeks in meeting and building friendships with local students and looking for opportunities to have discussions about faith with them). A couple of work trips that I had lined up have also been victims of the cull.

After the cancellation of my projects, I suddenly found myself getting very frustrated at the impact of what we're going through. Where is God in everything that is happening? I've spent much of my time over the last 6 months working on these projects. Has it all been in vain?



Our global project to Russia won't be taking place for the first time in 20 years!

The answer has got to be 'no'. I'm still convinced that God is good; Easter, after all, is the perfect time of year to remind us of that. Death will always be a bit of a taboo subject, but the fact remains that it is one of the only certainties in life (along with taxes). As Christians, Jesus' death at the first Easter has given us hope in the face of death (unfortunately, He still commanded us to pay our taxes, though)! The Resurrection demonstrates that Jesus has the power to defeat death, and all we need to do is confess to Him that He knows better than us about life, thank Him for what He's done for us – through Easter – and, as we've admitted that He knows best, we ask Him to help us to live the rest of our lives in the way that He demonstrated to us. Jesus' promise is that, if we respond to Him in this way, He will help us to, one day, defeat death just as He did! That's certainly something for us

to hold onto when everything that we usually rely on is under threat.

Don't worry; despite my disappointment, I'm not all doom and gloom about my work at the moment! I've been really encouraged by the reaction that I've seen in some people around me. In churches up and down the country, I'm sure, church leaders are exhorting us to not fear, but to see the incredible opportunity that we are being presented with to serve our neighbours, both in word and in deed. At my church here in Birmingham, St. Luke's Gas Street, our vicar (to a visibly depleted congregation on the last Sunday we were able to gather) encouraged us recently to take the opportunity to speak hope into the lives of our friends and neighbours who might be experiencing fear. More than that, though, we have a great opportunity to show love in practical ways; we can reach

out to those who are self-isolating by offering to bring them anything they need, give them a phone call, if they are missing communication, and even go out and do their shopping for them!

My neighbours, on my street here in Birmingham, collaborated to produce a flyer that we put through everyone's front doors to give out our contact details, to ask them to let us know if they are self-isolating and to offer the opportunity to reach out to us if they need help during that time. At a time when it sometimes feels like society is becoming more and more divided, it is an encouragement to see people making the effort to love and care for one another.

Thankfully, the cancellations of our global projects are giving me more time to work on another project that I've had on my mind since arriving back in the UK last summer.

Every year, thousands of UK students go overseas to study; the majority of these are foreign language students, but others

go as part of exchange programmes between universities. For Christian students, if they are involved in outreach on their campus here in the UK, their time overseas can end up being a break; they're in an unfamiliar place and they're not sure where to go to for support. With Agapé having a presence in over 190 countries across the world, it's my desire to set up a programme to help connect UK students with existing local Agapé teams in the places where they're going to study (if these teams currently exist) and to provide them with a coach, back in the UK, who can support them, and give them relevant training, so that they can stay active and make the most of their time in a different country. I'll do my best to keep you updated on my progress in developing the Agapé UK Study Abroad programme!

Thank you all for your ongoing support and prayer for my work from Blackmore and Stondon. I pray that you are all able to stay healthy and hopeful.

STAY SAFE - Online and Phone

In these challenging times we are all grateful for the array of technology that allows us to keep in touch. However, there are many unscrupulous people who are constantly trying to scam us to take our money or break our equipment. The following tips may prove helpful:

- No bank or other legitimate company will ever call you, text you or email you to ask for bank or any other personal details. Do not reveal these details however convincing they may sound.
- Do not click on any links in emails or messages unless you are 100% certain of the sender. If you are unsure manually type the website name to access it.
- Ensure you have different passwords for bank accounts, emails and other accounts / sites where your bank information is stored.
- Ideally have a different password for <u>all sites you log into</u> (this is difficult but if you
 use the same password and it becomes compromised the hacker then has free
 access to all other accounts / sites you use).
- Make a regular backup of you PC / Laptop / Phone—especially your important files / photos etc.
- If you receive an automated telephone call where you are asked to press a number to speak to someone about the issue—DO NOT—it will rack up high phone charges

Examples of some common current scams—(there are many others)

- TV Licensing will not text you to say your TV licence has expired
- Amazon will not call you to say your subscription is being auto-renewed
- HMRC will not call you to say you have a refund
- Microsoft will not call you to help you fix security issues they have detected
- Internet providers will not call you to say you are being disconnected

If you have any doubt whatsoever STOP.

If on the phone hang up or take a number to call them back. Then call a trusted friend or family member and ask for advice.

Doorstep Scams

New doorstep scams are emerging. Please take care and only answer the door if you are 100% sure of the person calling. Current scams include:

- People offering to do a Virus test for money SCAM
- People saying they need to take your dog into quarantine to prevent the spread of the virus—SCAM
- Cold callers offering kindness by way of running errands, collecting prescriptions and doing shopping - asking for cash upfront or for your credit / debit card and PIN—SCAM

If you experience any of these or other doorstep scams, please inform the police.
